What is an an essay? An op-ed? A first-person piece? A non-fiction short story?

"The personal essay has always been a stepchild of serious literature, seemingly formless, hard to classify. Lacking the tight construction of a short story or the narrative arc of a novel or memoir, such essays have given readers pleasure without winning cultural respect."

Essays are Inherently Different than Many Forms We've Looked at Before

- A theme rather than a point or objective
- How is it different than:
 - Narrative
 - Journalism
 - Diary

If they're formless, how do we put them together??

Five Approaches

- time dilation to give weight to the present
- larger societal complications of a singular incident
- object lessons
- vignettes:
 - "The personal essays that open the book are like snapshots, a memoir by glimpses, each from a different angle"
- about the questioning process
 - "The ultimate question may not be, What is the correct critical judgment to make of a particular film? but, What are our different needs and understandings at various stages in life?"

Regardless of approach, the lack of <u>landing</u> on a conclusion is key.

If it it doesn't make you uncomfortable, it's not honest.
